



A Discussion with Los Angeles City Attorney Rocky Delgadillo

A native of Los Angeles, Rocky Delgadillo became the highest-ranking Latino to win citywide office in more than 100 years when he was elected Los Angeles City Attorney on June 5, 2001. His top priorities include fighting crime, improving quality of life in our neighborhoods and reducing the city's civil liabilities. Delgadillo created Operation Bright Future, a tough anti-truancy program that targets sixth-graders with excessive absences. Delgadillo's signature program is the Neighborhood Prosecutor Program. For the first time in the city's history, prosecutors work in the neighborhoods, get to know residents on a first-name basis, and attack quality-of-life crimes where they occur. The program won a city Productivity Award in 2002 for its first-year achievements.

Delgadillo also has focused on fighting child abuse, elder and dependent adult abuse, immigration frauds, and environmental crimes. Before his election, Delgadillo was the Deputy Mayor of Los Angeles for Economic Development, where he worked to attract new jobs for the neighborhoods that needed them the most.
