We've made arrangements to see "Musical of Musicals" at the Colony Theatre in Burbank. The show is described as "a captivating, delightfully clever homage to America's favorite musical theatre creators, and a send-up of every musical you've ever seen." It's going to be a fun show you won't want to miss!

Lest you think there is no educational component, in addition to the play we will be meeting with Barbara Beckley, the artistic director and founder of the Colony Theatre, who will speak to us prior to the show at 7:00 PM. She is charming and funny and will tell us how she reached her present position in the theatre. Her credentials are impressive and her list of accolades include Woman in Theatre's Outstanding Contribution Award, and the James A. Doolittle Ovation Award for Leadership. She's been a member of Actors' Equity since 1967.

The Colony Theatre is located on Third Street and Magnolia, easy to reach, with free parking and easy access from the parking area. There are a number of restaurants just around the corner if you'd like to have dinner before the show.
